DIRECTIONS FROM
DOWNTOWN CHARLESTON:

Take Highway 17 south across the Ashley River and follow signs to Highway 61 North. Follow Hwy. 61 north for approximately 8 miles. Watch for the "Historical Plantations and Gardens" signs and the Drayton Hall signs. Drayton Hall entrance will be on your right.

Highway 61 (Ashley River Road) has been named a *National Scenic Byway* — you'll see why as you approach the gated entrance to Drayton Hall. The wooded landscape probably looks much like it did hundreds of years ago.

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
